If a certificate is issued in response to this application, the certificate will state only that the Law Society of Manitoba consents to the proposed name for your corporation. The certificate does **NOT** reserve the name, and does **NOT** imply that the Director appointed under *The Corporations Act* has approved the name. It is recommended that you apply under Regulation 2(10) of the Regulations to *The Corporations Act* to reserve the new name, **BEFORE** applying for the certificate from the Law Society.
